Maryland's Foreclosed Property Registry

Background

Legislation enacted during 2012 legislative session as a result of the Maryland Foreclosure Task Force recommendation to create a centralized registry which would allow government officials to better locate parties about the condition of foreclosed properties during the "limbo" period between a foreclosure auction and the ultimate recordation of the property deed.

Maryland's Office of the Commissioner of Financial Regulation is responsible for the creation and implementation of the registry.

Process-Purchasers

Purchasers are required to register the property within 30 days of the foreclosure auction. Several data points are gathered including the name, address and telephone number of the purchaser. There is a \$50 fee for an on-time registration and \$100 fee for a late registration. The purchaser is also required to complete a final registration within 30 days of the deed being recorded. They will have to provide, among other things, the record owner contact information. There is no fee for the final registration.

Local Jurisdictions

All counties or municipal corporations, their agencies and representatives have access to the data specific to their county.

To register: Visit the site and register as an export user. Once you register, OCFR will approve your request and assign your county. You should get an email indicating that your request has been approved in 24-48 hours.

Downloading Data: Once you have logged in using your username and password you will be able to down load data to an excel spreadsheet. You can do this by selecting a date range. There will be additional searches available soon.

Enforcement

Local jurisdictions may enact a law that imposes a civil penalty for failure to register a property in an amount not to exceed \$1,000.

Local jurisdictions, when taking action related to a residential property on the Registry can collect the cost associated with the action as a charge on the property tax bill when proper notice is given.
