FINAL ORDER

On this 22ND day of February, 2017, Panel B of the Maryland Home Improvement Commission ORDERS that:

1) Pursuant to Business Regulation Article, §8-408(b)(3)(i), Annotated Code of Maryland, the Claimant has provided the Commission with a copy of a final award in arbitration, dated February 29 and March 29, 2016, with all rights of appeal exhausted, in which the arbitrator found on the merits that the conditions precedent to recovery, as set forth in Business Regulation Article, §8-405(a), Annotated Code of Maryland, have been met, and found that the Claimant sustained an actual loss of \$3,334.08 as a result of unworkmanlike and incomplete performance by the Respondent.

2) The Commission directs payment of \$3,334.08 from the Home Improvement Guaranty Fund to the Claimant, William Farrell.

3) Pursuant to Business Regulation Article, §8-411(a), Annotated Code of Maryland, any home improvement licenses held by the Respondent, Laura Morin, shall be Suspended, and the Respondent shall be ineligible for any home improvement licenses, until the Respondent has repaid any money paid from the Home Improvement Guaranty Fund pursuant to this Order, with 10 percent annual interest.
