#### What is included in the Retail Sector?

The Retail Sector is comprised of establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. Retailing is the final step in the distribution of goods to consumers. In addition to retailing merchandise, some types of retailers engage in the provision of after-sales services, such as repair and installation. New automobile dealers, electronic and appliance stores and musical instrument stores are included among this group providing product service. In order to focus strategic planning goals, industries within the Retail Sector have been grouped into five categories as follows:


• Performance in the Retail Sector was relatively muted in the early part of the decade. The economic slowdown during the 2001-2003 period, coupled with reorganizations/closings among multiple merchandise retailers, dampened the pace of job generation in the sector. Growth in retail trade was limited to less than 1% through 2003, yielding a net gain of just 429 jobs in the sector.


- Movements in retail's subsectors were, however, mixed over this period. In the motor vehicle and building material subsectors, expansion continued without interruption, helping to downplay declines elsewhere in the sector. Building material and supplies dealers - a feeder industry for construction - turned in the best performance, adding about 2,031 jobs. Expansion in Howard County accounted for 30% of this upturn.
- The pace of job generation picked up during the latter part of 2003 and continued into 2005. Just over 7,500 jobs were added to the sector from 2003 through 2005. Employment in food and beverage stores, however, continued to decline. Within the subsector, declines in grocery stores were the most pronounced. About 5 out of every 10 jobs lost were in Montgomery County.



Maryland Employment Changes in Retail Subsectors 2001 - 2005







- Just over 18,600 establishments made up the Retail Sector during the 4th quarter of 2005. About 8 out of every 10 business sites in the sector employed fewer than 20 workers. Grocery stores, gasoline stations and health and personal stores were the most predominant employers in this size class, collectively accounting for just over a fourth of all small business locations.
- Grocery store employers were not only dominant in the small employer category, but, also among businesses employing 20-99 workers and 100-249 workers, accounting for 17.4% and 27.5% of all business locations, respectively. Among those employers with 250+ workers, department stores held the highest share of business locations, at 64.6%.
- Within the sector, the largest employment share, at 34.7%, was among mid-sized employers (20 to 99 workers).
   Employment in this size class was dominated by grocery stores, auto dealers and clothing stores. About 6 out of every 10 jobs this in size class were centered in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Montgomery and Prince George's counties.

Nearly 244,700 jobs, or about 83% of all employment in the Retail Sector, is in the above-referenced occupations. Within the sector, worker concentration is highest in occupations classified in the sales category. Employment among the top occupations of retail salespersons, cashiers, retail supervisors, counter and rental clerks and parts salespersons, when combined, accounts for about 54% of the staffing in the Retail Sector.




#### Employment Distribution in the Retail Sector by Economic Development Regions








### Average Weekly Wages in the Retail Sector by Workforce Area 2005



### Employment Changes in the Retail Sector by Workforce Area 2001- 2005




## Local Share of Statewide Employment in the Retail Sector 2005
